Volunteer Canada Paula Speevak, President and CEO

Her background includes applied research as the Managing Director of Carleton University's Centre for Voluntary Sector Research and Development, and a 24-year career as a practitioner and senior manager in the non-profit and voluntary sector in both institutional and community-based settings.
